📍 2025-2026 Nazarene Fast Facts

Together Nazarene

The Church of the Nazarene ministers in **165** world areas.

The number of Nazarene churches is **30,585** churches with **2,764,205** members.

In 2025, there were **473** districts and **29** pioneer areas around the world, with **32,226** credentialed clergy.*

Persons in need were treated at **community-based clinics and health care centers** all over the world with concentrated efforts in India, Papua New Guinea, and Eswatini (formerly known as Swaziland) were **467**.

Education

50 educational institutions, including graduate seminaries/theological colleges, **14** liberal arts colleges/universities (**13** with graduate programs), **18** undergraduate seminaries/theological/Bible colleges, **2** nurses training colleges, **1** teacher training college, and **1,023** education centers (extension) had 2024-2025 combined enrollment of **43,476** students globally.*

International Student Scholarship Fund (NMI 80th Anniversary project) provided **85** scholarships for students outside the US/Canada to attend Nazarene theological institutions.

Missions

In 2025, there were **464** missionaries originating from **64** world areas, serving in **88** countries. Of these missionaries, **339** served as global deployed and **127** were sponsored deployed. Last year, there were **72** new missionary deployments. Within these missionary families, there are **341** missionary kids.

Missionary Health Care provided US **\$336,276** in medical assistance for Nazarene missionaries, through offerings, Memorial Roll gifts, and Distinguished Service Award gifts.**

Churches globally gave US **\$25,600,000** for Approved Mission Projects.**

364 retired missionaries received benefits through the Global Missions Pension Plan for the 2023-2024 fiscal year.* Nazarenes gave US **\$4.2 million** in deputation and missionary support offerings for missionaries.**

Ministries

Alabaster

Nazarenes gave US **\$2.8 million** for Alabaster, to fund construction projects in 2025. The Alabaster Offering is used in all 6 global regions.** No Alabaster funds are used for administrative costs.

Care & Connection

NMI has all 6 regions participating in Care & Connection, creating personalized connections between local church districts, and missionaries around the world. Each connection is vital in continuing to share about the impact of missions.

Compassionate Ministries

NMI partnered with Nazarene Compassionate Ministries to give more than US **\$7.5 million**, for disaster response and compassion projects around the world and to support **10,000** children through Child Development Centers and Pastor's Kid programs.**

Jesus Film Harvest Partners

JFHP raising **\$4.8 million**, reports that World Evangelism Fund (WEF) helped provide infrastructure for **956** JFHP teams to share God's love. In from 1998-2025, teams reported **97,475,744** evangelistic contacts. Of these contacts, **20,403,043** indicated decisions for Christ with **10,065,282** new believers receiving initial discipleship follow-up. Teams started **158,624** Preaching Points.

World Evangelism Fund

NMI and others partnered with local churches to help raise **\$38,500,000** through the World Evangelism Fund during the 2025-2026 fiscal year.**

In 2025, **109** districts gave **5.5%** of their income and beyond to the World Evangelism Fund (**63** of which were from regions other than the US/Canada region). WEF giving beyond 5.5% helps open new work, sustains works opened in recent years, and helps send new missionaries that God calls.

World Mission Broadcast

Nazarenes gave US **\$217,550** to World Mission Broadcast (WMB), providing radio, television, and Internet programs to share the gospel globally.**

Alabaster

Laying the foundation through Alabaster offerings for places where people worship, heal, and learn.

Care & Connection

Providing care and connection between missionaries and local churches of the Nazarene.

Care and Connection encompasses global and sponsored. It begins when a missionary discerns a call to missions, continues during their service, and throughout the adjustment of returning to their home country.

CARE includes the steps where NMI is involved in nurturing, sending, and supporting Nazarene missionaries from Nazarene churches and their districts.

CONNECTION consists of ways in which NMI connects with and supports Nazarene missionaries.

LINKS is part of NMI's Care and Connection, assisting churches and districts in intentional care and connection to globally deployed Nazarene missionaries who are not from their district.

The Preteen Campers put together **36 Cases** of School Pal Paks (**360 Paks**) These went to six domestic locations to distributions for children and schools:

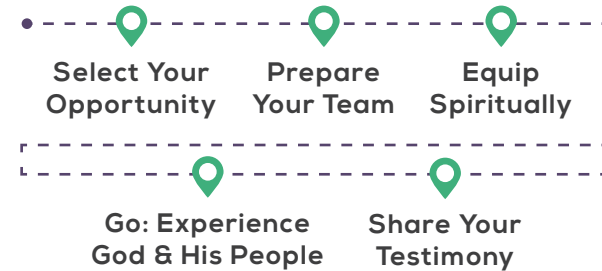
OKC Tulakes Community - 4 cases

Links/Care & Connection

Care encompasses the activities in which NMI is engaged to nurture, send, and support Nazarene missionaries from Nazarene churches and districts.

Connection consists of ways NMI connects and supports Nazarene missionaries, including Nazarene missionaries from Nazarene churches and districts, Links assigned missionaries, and Nazarene missionaries visiting Nazarene churches and districts for deputation.

Links is part of NMI's Care and Connection and is an NMI system to assist districts in providing additional care and connection to globally deployed Nazarene missionaries who are not from their district. Each region, through the sending district, provides care and connection to Nazarene missionaries sent from their region.

Participating **Links** missionaries are assigned to districts for a two-year cycle to help foster a personal connection between missionaries and the local church. Both the **Links** and **Care & Connection** relationship fosters a sense of involvement with Nazarene Missions through regular correspondence, updates from their field of service, and presentations when they are on home assignment.

Many **Links** and **Care & Connection** missionaries share newsletters, with the latest updates. You can also find more information on the Oklahoma NMI Facebook page or missionary.nazarene.org.

Deputation

Hosting a Missionary Practical Tips for Local Churches

1 Designate a Contact Person

Assign a reliable person to assist the missionary prior to and throughout their visit to ensure all needs are met. The contact should be accessible by email and phone.

2 Communicate With Missionary

As soon as your missionary is scheduled, the designated contact person should communicate important details to them including logistics, special needs, and reimbursements associated with the visit.

- **Event details** (date, start time, time zone, location/address)
- **Contact person** (name and phone number)
- **Event type & schedule** (how often and how long they'll speak)
- **Audience** (age range and expected size)
- **Dress code**
- **Church/district connection to their ministry or country**
- **Available technology** (including projection capabilities)

3 Promote the Event

Invite your congregation to hear what God is doing worldwide. Use the missionary's Nazarene.org profile for info and materials (if available), and always confirm with the missionary before sharing their name, photos, or posting services online.

4 Assist with Travel Costs

Missionaries cover travel expenses personally or through deputation funds. Churches and districts are encouraged to help with meals, mileage, airfare, and lodging reimbursement.

5 Ensure Comfortable Accommodations

Provide accommodations that meet the missionary's needs, including internet access. They may prefer a hotel, AirBNB, or staying with a church family - ask their preference. Verify the number of people traveling. Also, ask about dietary restrictions and let them know of any meal plans ahead of time.

6 Space for Deeper Connection

Missionaries value connecting with your church. Schedule time for your congregation to get to know them. Encourage interaction with small groups, youth, and children, and stay in touch after the visit.

7 Support Each Other in the Mission of God

Discuss with your missionary how to support one another in God's mission. Ask them to share about the World Evangelism Fund and ways your church can get involved. Collect offerings after the missionary speaks, and clarify beforehand how funds will be distributed (i.e. Funding the mission, check)

8 Contribute Financial Support

In order to provide space for the congregation to respond, receive the offering after the missionary shares at the end of the service or gathering. Deputation funds help with specific missionary needs such as ministry expenses, housing, travel, medical deductibles and co-pays, children's education, and more.

9 Pray

Prayer prepares hearts for mission. Schedule times to pray for the missionary and your congregation before and during their visit.

10 Setting for Services, Sharing & Fellowship

Missionaries enjoy telling their story in whatever setting it is in, a regular church service, a zone rally, a cook-out, a men's prayer breakfast, a ladies Bible study, a VBS night, a pool party, a children's emphasis, coffee with a few ministers, a nursing home, game night with families or teenagers, dinner with a local president, family, friends, or pastor. These events may be held any day of the week. Smaller events like taking them out to dinner or entertaining them in your home.

They have fellowship with us and us with them; we are also providing meals for them on the weekdays. This helps reduce their deputation costs for them. Keep us posted if you would like to entertain them on a free day or take them shopping (grocery store, mall, etc.).

Mission Education

Nazarenes share mission stories to inspire passion and involvement. Hearing how others follow God's call encourages participation, and NMI provides resources to help churches inform and engage their members. The Missionary Book List makes available missionary books for both children and adults.



Faith Promise

A plan for regular missions giving beyond the tithe, with individuals prayerfully committing to give weekly, biweekly, or monthly.

Prepare/Plan With Your Pastor and Council:

- Set the date and plan an emphasis
- Length of emphasis: 1) Saturday night and Sunday morning, 2) Sunday morning only, 3) Sunday morning and evening
- Discuss specific responsibilities for the emphasis
- Who will be the speaker? Who will book the speaker?
- Special gatherings: Friday evening rally, Saturday men's prayer breakfast, women's luncheon, teen pizza party Saturday night, service project for teens with commissioning from the missionary on Saturday

Ask

About a missions bulletin board, the church calendar, and how and when the deadlines are for submitting mission information for the Sunday morning church worship folder, church newsletter, or website.

Discuss

With your council the amount that needs to be raised for missions for the coming year, starting with the World Evangelism Fund (5.5% of current income), special offerings, local NMI Council expenses, missionary speakers - both care and offerings.

Service

After your speaker gives the presentation, the local president or pastor should instruct the congregation on how to fill out a commitment card or give online.

Local NMI President

The role of the local NMI President is to promote NMI in the local church in cooperation with the pastor. You are a voting member of the church board and lead the local NMI council.

There are five key areas of impact: **Prayer, World Evangelism Fund, Alabaster, Children & Youth, and Care & Connection.** Every church should participate regardless of their size, location, or language. The local church can have maximum impact on missions in the Church of the Nazarene with your leadership!

We aim for each church to participate in these five areas, and then adding additional areas of connection, to match the interests and needs of each local congregation or district. These items are stepping stones to deeper involvement in missions support through the Church of the Nazarene --from Care & Connection Missionaries or the LINKS missionaries. Whatever you share puts the needs of our missionaries and the work before our people to help pray for our missions in 165 different nations.

NMI Delegates for Oklahoma District Assembly

Delegates shall be church members (15 years of age or older). The number of elected delegates shall be based on the following formula: two delegates from each local church of 25 members or fewer, and one additional delegate for each additional 25 members.

Automatic Delegates for The District Assembly/NMI Convention:

(The following are considered ex-officio and should not be on your ballot as delegates.)

- Retired pastors & missionaries
- Missionaries on home assignment
- District NMI Council members
- Incoming & outgoing local NMI presidents

Sunday morning bookings are prime for getting most of the local church together to hear of their ministries.

When having a missionary come, feel free to ask the missionary to speak with your children or youth or both. Missionaries love sharing with the young people. They can speak to the during the Sunday School hour, Wednesday nights, VBS, children's church. Don't miss an opportunity for them to speak with your young people. Larger churches may invite a missionary to speak at their church for the a.m. service and share the missionary with a smaller one in the area for the p.m. service.
