2025 NAZARENE FAST FACTS

EDUCATION

The Church of the Nazarene ministers in 165 world areas.

TOGETHER NAZARENE

The number of Nazarene churches dropped to 30,585 churches with 2,780,000 members, an increase from last year.

In 2024, there were **473** districts and 29 pioneer areas around the world, with **31,688** credentialed clergy.*

NMI membership for 2024 was 2.78 million with 30,585 organized churches around the world.

Persons in need were treated at community-based clinics and *health care centers* all over the world with concentrated efforts in India, Papua New Guniea, and Eswatini (formerly known as Swaziland).*

MISSIONS

In 2024, there were 466 missionaries originating from 60 world areas, serving in 81 countries. Of these missionaries, 339 served as global deployed and 127 were sponsored deployed. Last year, there were 38 new missionary deployments. Within these missionary families, there are 317 missionary kids.

Missionary Health Care provided US \$336,276 in medical assistance for Nazarene missionaries, through offerings, Memorial Roll gifts, and Distinguished Service Award gifts.**

Churches globally gave US \$25,600,000 for Approved Mission Projects.**

364 retired missionaries received benefits through the Global Missions Pension Plan for the 2023-2024 fiscal year.* Nazarenes gave US \$4.2 million in deputation and missionary support offerings for missionaries.**

arts colleges/universities theological/Bible colleges, 1,023 education centers (extension) had 2023-2024

International Student Scholarship Fund (NMI 80th Anniversary project) provided 85 scholarships for students outside the US/Canada to attend Nazarene theological institutions.

MINISTRIES ALABASTER

Nazarenes gave US \$2.8 million for Alabaster, to fund construction projects in 2024. The Alabaster Offering is used in all 6 global regions.** No Alabaster funds are used for administrative costs.

JESUS FILM HARVEST PARTNERS

JFHP raising \$4.8 million, reports that World Evangelism Fund (WEF) helped provide infrastructure for 1,166 JFHP teams to share God's love. In 2024, teams reported 2.3 *million* evangelistic contacts. Of these contacts, 688,936 indicated decisions for Christ with 394,969 new believers receiving initial discipleship follow-up. Teams started **12,866** Preaching Points in 2024.

50 educational institutions. including graduate seminaries/ theological colleges, 14 liberal (13 with graduate programs), 18 undergraduate seminaries/ 2 nurses training colleges, 1 teacher training college, and combined enrollment of 43.476 students globally.*

WORLD EVANGELISM FUND

NMI and others partnered with local churches to help raise \$38,500,000 through the World Evangelism Fund during the 2023-2024 fiscal vear.**

In 2024, **109** districts gave **5.5%** of their income and beyond to the World Evangelism Fund (63 of which were from regions other than the US/Canada region). WEF giving beyond 5.5% helps open new work, sustains works opened in recent years, and helps send new missionaries that God calls.

WORLD MISSION BROADCAST

Nazarenes gave US \$217.550 to World Mission Broadcast (WMB), providing radio, television, and Internet programs to share the gospel globally.**

COMPASSIONATE MINISTRIES

NMI partnered with Nazarene Compassionate Ministries to give more than US \$7.5 million, for disaster response and compassion projects around the world and to support 10,000 children through Child Development Centers and Pastor's Kid programs.**

CARE & CONNECTION

NMI has all 6 regions participating in Care & Connection, creating personalized connections between local church districts, and missionaries around the world. Each connection is vital in continuing to share about the impact of missions.

ENGAGING CHILDREN & YOUTH

NMI encourages each church on every district to be intentional in providing opportunities of service for children and youth, creating an environment where they can hear and respond to God's call. This can happen through the ministries of Nazarene Youth International and Nazarene Discipleship International together as they engage all ages of the church. We believe nurturing and leadership development are best done in the local church and are individualized to the needs of each and every person.

CARE & CONNECTION

CARE & CONNECTION is provided to every global and sponsored Nazarene missionary who is on contract with Global Missions by their home district.

LINKS is a network of personal connections between missionaries and Nazarene districts around the world. Participating LINKS missionaries are assigned to districts for a year to help foster a personal connection between missionaries and the local church. Both the LINKS and CARE & CONNECTION relationship brings a sense of involvement with Nazarene Missions through regular correspondence, updates from their field of service, and presentations when they are on home assignment.

Pack kits by obtaining banana boxes from your local grocery store. Cut the heavy brown paper in half; tape on half over the bottom and the other half over the top, covering holes. Leave the handles open. Ship 6 kits into a banana box with NOTHING EXTRA.

Gather **NEW** items in guantities listed below. Assemble School Pal-Paks (SPPs) and seal the zip-close bags. Include only those items listed below. Deviating from this list can cause an entire shipment to be rejected in customs. Set the SPPs in groups of ten (10) to determine the number of boxes needed.

These contents will give each student a notebook, 5-6 pencils, 5-6 pens, an eraser, and a ruler. Two students will share the colored pencils, scissors, and sharpener.


7 unscented sanitary pads (regular absorbency, each individually wrapped, all placed in a 1-quart zip-close plastic bag, then added to the kit)

The OK District with SW OK. NEOK and S. Ark. Sent 504 cases on 12 pallets (3,024 kits) through NCM and Convoy of Hope in Sept. 2024. Two-thirds of those twelve pallets of CCKs (340 cases) came from 27 churches on the Oklahoma District.

DEPUTATION/HOME ASSIGNMENT



Missionaries travel to their home country every few years to raise money to support the ministry expenses including housing. equipment, training, ministry travel, ministry tools, and small projects. Funds support other expenses, including education of the missionary's children, further education for the missionary, retirement, allowances, and benefits.

When you have a missionary come to your church for a deputation or Faith Promise service, here are a few things to remember while hosting:

PRAY for your scheduled missionaries prior to their arrival, asking for specific prayer requests, then share with your congregation.

COMMUNICATE with the missionary: date, start time, location, type of event, cell phone number of contact person, do they need transportation, how many times and how long they will speak, appropriate dress, and anticipated audience age and number attending.

ASK what kind of technology support will they need and what you are able to accommodate. Will they need interpretation while presenting? Need a table to display items? Do they have time commitments following the event? Can you use their name, picture, and field of service when promoting? Can you post or stream the service?

ACCOMMODATIONS will need to have Wi-Fi access. may be a hotel, Airbnb, or home setting; please ask the missionary's preference. Let them know you will be covering their lodging and food while with you.

CONNECT missionaries with small groups, children, youth and anyone discerning a call to serve as a missionary. Have the children and youth stay in the service.

SUPPORT the missionary speaker with a deputation offering. Always receive an offering at the end of the service after the missionary shares.

TIPS

- Alternative menu choices include ethnic foods, or any combination of soup, salad, sandwiches or chips and water to drink.
- Ask your visitor if they would like access to a kitchen for private meals.
- Offer breakfast rather than a late night snack. Even nonbreakfast eaters are usually willing to chat over juice, coffee, or tea if they have gotten a good night's sleep.
- Hotels can be a good way to give the speaker a break. If both options are available, ask which is preferred. Travelers can get lonely. A mix of hotel and homestays is best.
- Ask your visitor what they would like to do.
- Each town has its own charm. Find yours and share it with those who are interested.
- For a healthy dessert, offer fresh fruit or skip it all together (especially if you intend to take the guest out after the service).

Faith Promise is a plan based on missions giving at systematic intervals rather than just twice a year. Through Faith Promise, people pray about the amount they should give for missions (over and above their tithe). The amount is often given weekly, biweekly, or monthly.

HOW TO PREPARE AND PLAN FAITH PROMISE WITH YOUR PASTOR AND COUNCIL:

- Set the date and plan a Faith Promise emphasis.
- Discuss your specific responsibilities for the Faith Promise emphasis.
- Who will be the speaker? Who will book the speaker?
- Length of Faith Promise emphasis: Saturday? Sunday morning only? Sunday morning & evening? Saturday night and Sunday morning?
- Plan for special gatherings? Friday evening rally, Saturday men's breakfast, women's lunch, teen pizza party Saturday night?

ASK YOUR PASTOR about a missions bulletin board, the church calendar, and how and when the deadlines are for submitting mission information for the Sunday morning church worship folder, church newsletter, or website.

DISCUSS with your council the amount that needs to be raised for missions for the coming year, starting with the World Evangelism Fund (5.5% of current income), special offerings, local NMI Council expenses, missionary speakers - both care and offerings.

FAITH PROMISE SERVICE: After your speaker gives the presentation, the local president or pastor should instruct the congregation on how to fill out a commitment card or give online.

NAZARENE MISSIONS INTERNATIONAL

Nazarene Missions International is the organization responsible for engaging and mobilizing the local church to engage in missions in the Church of the Nazarene and is the denominations' representative for missions on the district and in the local church.

LOCAL NMI PRESIDENT

The role of the local NMI President is to promote NMI in the local church in cooperation with the pastor. You are a voting member of the church board and lead the local NMI council.

- There are five key areas of impact in which every church should participate regardless of their size, location, or language. The local church can have maximum impact on missions in the Church of the Nazarene with your leadership! These are the NMI Top Five Areas of Impact: PRAYER, WORLD EVANGELISM FUND, ALABASTER, **CHILDREN & YOUTH, CARE & CONNECTION.**
- Focusing on these five areas of impact does not diminish other areas of NMI influence. These items are stepping stones to deeper involvement in missions support through the Church of the Nazarene. They are a way to begin to become involved; they are easily understood and we are striving for them to be adaptable in every culture. We aim for each church to participate in these five areas, and then adding additional areas of connection, to match the interests and needs of each local congregation or district.

IF YOUR LOCAL CHURCH FOCUSES ON THE FIVE AREAS OF IMPACT, YOU ARE AN NMI PRIORITY ONE CHURCH, WITH OR WITHOUT A LOCAL NMI PRESIDENT.

The local NMI president is required to complete a Local NMI President's Report at the end of each church year. A majority of the questions are asked from Global NMI and a few are from the District NMI, including a list of recipients of the Memorial Roll and Distinguished Service Award.

Throughout the year, keep a list of outreach participation that your church does as a whole or a few that represented your church during the church year. This will make reporting much easier for you in March. Example: donated to local food bank, helped with ROC. sponsored a child through NCM, Work & Witness trip to (list country), etc. Please keep in mind that participation in the Five Areas of Impact is what determines the Mission Priority One Award. These are the baseline for criteria.

NMI DELEGATES FOR OKLAHOMA DISTRICT ASSEMBLY

Delegates shall be church members (15 years of age or older). The number of elected delegates shall be based on the following formula: two delegates from each local church of 25 members or fewer, and one additional delegate for each additional 25 members.
